


# Can you help us study how hospital clinicians use computerised care records?

## **Who are we?**

We are a University research team studying how NHS hospital clinicians in Hampshire use computerised care records. We want to see where computerised care records are most useful and how they help healthcare professionals to manage patient care. We also want to understand why computerised care records are sometimes difficult to use and how we can overcome that.

## **Who are we looking for?**

We want to talk to people who have been admitted to an NHS hospital in Hampshire in the last two years. We want to explain our research and ask your opinions about our study. We would be particularly interested if you have experienced situations when clinicians seemed unaware of important facts in your medical history. Or you may just be interested in how to improve clinical access to patient information and make hospital care safer and more efficient.
